Match Report

Tuesday 19 November

Uxbridge v Harefield Utd – Middx Senior Cup 2nd Round

Bad Hare Day

Uxbridge bowed out of this seasons Middlesex Senior Cup with a disappointing defeat on penalties to Combined Counties side Harefield Utd on Tuesday evening.

On a bitterly cold November evening, Uxbridge never really got into their stride, and although they did have opportunities to win the match, Harefield were full of confidence and on balance probably deserved to go through.

It had looked as though the home side had taken an early lead on just 4 minutes, but Alex Witham's header was ruled out for offside. Massimo Giamatti then shot just wide on 10 mins, as did Leo Donnellan 5 minutes later as Uxbridge tried to assert themselves over the visitors. Harefield though looked confident – under the tutorship of ex-reds favourite Wayne Carter – as the half wore on, they fashioned chances with Justin Davis shooting over when well placed on the half an hour. The Hares did take the lead 6 minutes later when another former Uxbridge player Gareth Chendlik smashed home a loose ball after a goalmouth scramble which Uxbridge failed to clear. That was the last significant action as the visitors held onto the lead at the break

The scores should have been level just 3 minutes into the second half though, when Witham's low cross found Wilson Chingoka with the goal gaping 3 yards out, but the ball somehow went wide. Harefield kept coming though and they looked increasingly comfortable as Uxbridge struggled to break them down. They could have doubled their lead on 65 minutes, but Lenny Farhall (yet another ex-red) shot just wide. It looked as though it would be a frustrating evening, however Witham hauled Uxbridge level on 77 minutes when he was played in by Ada Okorogheye, and his cross shot found its way into the top corner with Harefield keeper Tom Clark left rooted to the line. Ada Okorogheye could have snatched it – but his header from a corner was just over as he couldn't quite get underneath the ball. Substitute George Moore then had a couple of good chances to score as the game entered the latter stages with a couple of sighters and then went even closer as his shot from the edge of the box was tipped onto the bar by Clark. Ultimately though the game ended level and onto penalties.

The usually dependable Witham failed with the first spot kick, and Harefield held their nerve with the next 3 before Archie Coulter was denied by George Legg to take it to sudden death. George Moore was then denied by Clark, and it was left for Dominic Jones to slot the ball home to take Harefield through to the next round.

Match Report

Saturday 23 November Ashford Town (Middx) v Uxbridge

Uxbridge Weather the Storm

Storm Bert provided an interesting subtext to this match on Saturday, as the swirling wind and rain - especially as the game wore on, made for challenging conditions. It was however the visiting Reds who mastered them best to take the three points, making it 30 points taken from the last 13 games - moving them up to 5th place and into the play-offs.

It was the home side who started better though, and they took the lead with the first action of any note on 7 minutes, when a cross came on from the left-hand side, and Tristan Francois Vernal was left to head the ball home at the far post. It wasn't until the quarter hour mark that Uxbridge mustered anything like a chance, when a corner was pulled back to the edge of the box, and Leo Decabo saw his shot blocked and deflected over the bar. It was the home side making the running though, Liam Moore was unable to connect with a cross when well-placed which would have made it two. Vernal nearly doubled his tally on 38 minutes, as his shot was narrowly over. George Moore was providing Uxbridge's main threat, and he had a shot saved well at the near post just before the break - but ultimately a frustrating half came to an end.

It was a different Uxbridge who came out second half, now they were first to loose balls and really started to exert some pressure on the home side. Just 2 minutes into the half they drew level when Moore was played in, and he lashed a fierce shot high past the keeper into the top corner. On 53 minutes the home side had a good chance to retake the lead when a good break saw Jaden Atkinson clear, but his shot went wide. That was Ashford's last chance of note, and as the weather deteriorated, Uxbridge got stronger. The Reds took the lead on the hour, as Moore again was played into the box, and this time it was a calm low finish past the keeper that gave him his 11 goal in all competitions this season. Ten minutes later it was home keeper Marcin Brzozowski - who performed admirably at Honeycroft in the return fixture back in September - who had to be at his best again, keeping out a powerful header from CJ Fearn, when he seemed certain to score. Moore thought he had his hat-trick on 81 minutes but was flagged offside as he looped the ball into the net. He had another chance on 86 minutes, but Brzozowski was again equal to the shot, blocking well low down. Uxbridge ended the game strongly, with Scott Armsworth going close with a header, and Ada Okorogheye having done well to get into the box past the defence, saw his shot blocked from a narrow angle. There was time for Luke Paris to make an appearance as a makeshift striker, and he almost made an instant impact, breaking clear and curling a low shot that Brzozowski was just able to parry.

Uxbridge though were good value for the win and now face a tricky midweek trip to South Park (Reigate) on Tuesday evening, a ground that hasn't been a happy hunting ground - but they can go into the match full of confidence.

Match Report

Tuesday 26 November South Park (Reigate) v Uxbridge

Reds Head North at South Park

Uxbridge climbed to the heady heights of 3rd place in the league, with a win at South Park (Reigate) on Tuesday evening. Never the happiest of hunting grounds for The Reds, this was a composed performance in what could well have been a tricky match.

In the reverse of Saturday's match at Ashford, it was Uxbridge who took an early lead on 8 minutes, as the ever-impressive George Moore broke into the box from a fine Alex Witham pass and clipped his shot over the onrushing keeper to notch his 12th goal of the season. 2 minutes later the lead could have been doubled when a corner was deflected onto the inside of his own post by a South Park defender, but the ball was scrambled clear. On 28 minutes, Moore again broke through, but as he lifted the ball over the keeper Danny Bracken, he was brought down – however the referee deemed it not a penalty and waved play on. For the remainder of the half, Uxbridge always looked in control but were still unable to get the cushion of a second goal, the best chance came on 36 minutes when a Leo Decabo free kick was whipped across the face of goal, but nobody was able to get a touch, and it went inches wide.

Uxbridge made all the running early on in the second half, a well worked short corner routine saw the ball again just deflected wide, Moore then tried to return the favour setting up a good chance for Alex Witham, but he shot on the run was just off target. Moore though was at the heart of all the good work and was the one who finally got the visitors second on 73 minutes, as Witham played the ball into his feet on the edge of the box, Moore spun his defender and expertly fired a low shot into the far corner, an excellent goal and one that took his tally to 13 in all competitions. It could have been three on 85 minutes, but Witham – who had worked tirelessly up front all evening – just headed wide from a fine Uxbridge break. The home sides best chance came with time running out, as Legg was called into action to save well from a quick break.

However, it was to be Uxbridge's evening, and they now face a real test on Saturday as 4th placed Hartley Wintney come to Honeycroft, but with the Reds in good form, they have every reason to feel confident.

ARTIFICIAL Intelligence (AI) is getting everywhere these days – even now in football it seems.

This week, The NLP ran an article on former Non-League and Football League player turned sports agent, Guy Branston, who has launched a new AI venture that he says will revolutionise the way clubs engage with their supporters.

The ex-centre-half has launched an AI bot named Mai that he says can help clubs speak to thousands more fans - and even reach a global audience.

One of Branston's former clubs, Rotherham United, as well as Premiership Rugby side Leicester Tigers have already signed up to the service - named Sports AI Consultants - and Branston says talks are underway with several other sports clubs.

Branston, 45, made over 400 career appearances for a variety of clubs through the EFL including Hull City, Sheffield Wednesday and Peterborough United. He also turned out for a number of now Non-League clubs, such as Oldham Athletic, Aldershot Town, Rochdale and Torquay United and had a season-long spell at Kettering Town in the Conference National back in 2008-09.

After retiring in 2014, he subsequently worked as chief scout at Notts County, operations manager at Nuneaton Town and director of football at Chesterfield before becoming a licensed agent in 2023.

Explaining how AI can revolutionise sports consultancy, Branston explains: "the advent of artificial intelligence (AI) has transformed numerous sectors, and the realm of sports consulting is no exception" Branston explains on his LinkedIn page.

AI-powered sports consultants are at the forefront of this transformation, utilizing advanced algorithms and data analytics to enhance fan engagement and optimize team performance. Speaking our sister paper, The Football League Paper, for whom he also doubles up as a columnist, Branston continued: "In the simplest terms, it's an AI bot that will have a conversation directly with the fan or customer over the phone, "So, imagine you're a football club or a rugby club and you're offering a half-season ticket for sale.























"Traditionally, that would be advertised via email or a social media post, but those things are very cold and impersonal. A social media post can be missed. Emails can drop into junk folders or not get opened. "And there's a good reason why things are done this way. At most clubs - particularly lower league clubs - there simply aren't enough arms and legs in the building to call fans individually.

The secretary is doing multiple jobs. The marketing people are flat out. Even if you could afford to hire a telemarketer, how many people would they reach in a day? Maybe 100. It's not worth it. What Mai can do is call 2,000 people a day and have a conversation in any language. It can take the 'temperature' of the conversation to work out whether someone is annoyed or unhappy or eager to hear more and respond accordingly.

Then, at the end of that day, the club gets a report saying how many people engaged with the call, how many people have requested a text message with a link to the landing page that sells the season ticket, and how many people bought one. "And this is just one application. Right now, we're looking at how clubs could use AI to address mental health issues - engaging with lonely ex-players, getting kids back into football who've had a hard time after being released.

This really does have the potential to revolutionise the way clubs communicate.

George Moore (Midfield)

Attacking midfielder who joined us from Harrow Borough in 2023. Last season's top scorer, which saw him voted Supporters Player of the year. Was regularly amongst the goals at Step 3.

Andrio Brandao (Midfield)

Skilful, attacking midfielder who joined from Virginia Water last season. Made a big impression during the latter part of the campaign and everyone at the club is excited to watch his progress this season.

Wilson Chingoka (Midfielder)

All action midfielder who joined the club in January 2024. Big personality who has experience at Step 3. Previous clubs include Nuneaton Borough, Potters Bar Town, Lewes, Bedford Town, Staines Town and Northwood.

Leo Donnellan (Midfielder)

Former QPR youngster who has played for Finn Harps in the League of Ireland, and Portadown in Northern Ireland. Joined The Reds in October 2024 from Hanwell Town. Previous clubs include Harrow Borough, Dagenham & Redbridge, Enfield Town and Maidstone United.

Glenn Yala (Defender/Midfield)

Played at Chalfont St Peter for Manager Danny Edwards. Vastly experienced player whose versatility makes him a managers dream. Former North Greenford United, Waltham Abbey, Aylesbury, Hanwell Town and Chertsey Town player.

Fabio Sole (Midfield/Forward)

Young attacking midfielder signed from Hendon in November 2024. Played for Hanwell Town in season 2023-24. Started his career with Reading U-18s, moving on to Oxford United U-18s from whom he went on loan to Farnborough. On leaving Oxford United he took a career break, then joined Slough Town and Met. Police before joining Hanwell in July 2023, and then onto Hendon in July 2024

Ada Okorogheye (Forward)

Came through the Academy at Slough Town before moving to the United States to study and play "soccer". Played last season at step 3 with Beaconsfield Town. Scored a hat-trick on his Uxbridge debut at Cobham in the FA Cup.

Uxbridge FC Club History

In the late 19th century, the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd of February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr. William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel.

Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC. The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874, but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year.

The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition, and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesborough in the final at Crystal Palace. Unfortunately, their Northeast rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club, they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs, and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920.

A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3.

Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit. Championship celebrations, however, were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deducted six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow.

Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War. During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town.

Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr. W.S. Try. The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1. This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963, and the club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warmup for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0. The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.

They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South-Central Division.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager in over fifty years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18 years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019. Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's. The Middlesex Chairty Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. This feat was repeated last season when North Greenford United were defeated 2-1 in the final at Bedfont Sports.

In recent times the club has mourned the passing of several club stalwarts. President Alan Odell, who had been associated with The Reds for eighty years, in 2016. Chairman Alan Holloway in 2021 and the club's long-standing Treasurer, David Tucker, passed away in 2022. "Mr. Uxbridge" had been associated with the club for over 50 years and was a massive influence in the running of Uxbridge Football Club.

From his legacy the club have been able to undertake the installation of a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, upgraded LED floodlights, a new 158-seat stand, dug-outs and both pitch-surround and perimeter fencing. More improvements are planned!

Hartley Wintney Football Club History

HARTLEY Wintney Football Club was founded in 1897, the club's nickname 'The Row', coming from Hartley Row, a former hamlet of Hartley Wintney.

In the 1940s and 50s, the club played at Causeway Farm adjacent to the cricket club, in the Basingstoke League. The minutes of meetings covering 15 seasons from 1948, compiled by the club's outstanding secretary Fred Cook, includes the change of club colours from blue squares to tangerine in 1956.

The club moved to the Memorial Ground on Green Lane in 1953 and later joined the Aldershot League. In 1973, Glynn Howells was appointed as manager. In his six-year reign, the team won the Aldershot Senior League three times in succession, and the Aldershot Senior Cup.

A founder member of the Combined Counties League in 1978, Hartley later appointed Ian Bedford as manager. An influx of senior players during the 80s included several ex-pros: Mick Travers (ex-Reading, Portsmouth and Aldershot); Richard Walden (ex-Aldershot, Sheffield Wednesday and Newport County) and Steve Finnieston (ex-Chelsea, Cardiff City and Sheffield United).

Under Bedford's management, the club won the Aldershot Senior Cup (1980/81), the George Allen Cup (1981/82) and the Combined Counties League (1982/83). A new clubhouse was opened with David Willoughby, secretary and treasurer, and Bill Mitchell, club chairman, devoting exceptional hours to this venture.

The club gained promotion to the Combined Counties Premier under the management of Mike Scott in 2007/08, but the following season ended in relegation. The team rallied following the appointments of Pete Gray and John Condon in 2009/10 and Louis King in 2010/11.

Neville Roach then took charge for 2011/12, assisted by Mick Wollen and Scott Tarr, and the club finished 3rd in CCL Div. 1, which was good enough for a return to the Premier Division. But the euphoria of promotion was dampened when the coaching staff and nearly the entire squad left at the end of the season.

Ex-Millwall defender Dave Tuttle was given the summer to prepare a squad for 2012/13. However, a string of poor results led to a second change in management within four months and 24-year-old ex-Hartley striker Ben Dillon was given his first managerial role.

Alongside Jason Minton and Joe Lawler, Dillon set about rebuilding, with Hartley well adrift at the bottom of the table. The introduction of a talented group of players restored the spirit around the club and, in what became known as the club's 'Great Escape', the Row's place in the CCL Premier was secured against all the odds.

Finishing 7th in CCL Premier in 2013/14, the footballing highlight was the run to the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the first ever time, losing to Daventry Town in front of a home crowd of over 1,000. The new club crest was commissioned during the season; designer Philippa Bell incorporated elements from the 13th century when the village of Hertleye Wynteneye drew its name from 'the clearing in the forest where the deer graze by Winta's island', hence the tree and stag motifs.

The 2014/15 season saw the club finish 9th in the CCL Premier, after which Dillon stepped down: Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick were appointed as joint managers, with Luke Tuffs as first team coach. 2015/16 was very eventful. After a memorable FA Cup win at Merthyr Town, Hartley came back from two down, only to concede an injury time goal at Conference South side Eastbourne Borough. In the FA Vase, a longstanding club record was broken by reaching the 5th Round Proper. In front of a sellout 1,300 at Green Lane, eventual finalists Hereford proved too strong, but the Row went on to claim the CCL Premier Division title; however, promotion was denied due to ground grading.

The 2016/17 season under Brownlie and Millerick was extraordinary. Propelled by the goals of strike duo Sam Argent and Ross Cook, the Row topped the CCL Premier Division for the entire season, reached the semi-final of the Hampshire Senior Cup and the final of the Aldershot Senior Cup. Guided by chairman Luke Mullen, the club secured the required ground grading to take their place in the Southern League at Step 4 for the first time.

2017/18 was as successful as the previous season. The club embarked on their first FA Trophy campaign, going out in the 1st Round Proper to eventual finalists Bromley. In Southern League South (East Division), the Row sat within the top four for much of the season. A play-off place was secured, with the Row winning their semi-final against AFC Dunstable. In front of a crowd of over 700 at Green Lane, a tense game against Cambridge City was decided by a Nic Ciardini goal – who was on the end of Jack Balls towering header – to gain promotion to Southern Premier South at Step 3. The season's closing highlight was lifting the Aldershot Senior Cup.

With Dan Turkington now alongside Millerick in the dugout, 2018/19 started well at Step 3, with a late run seeing Hartley finish 8th. To remain at that level required another round of ground improvements, stretching the club and its volunteers to the limit.

The 2019/20 campaign clicked into gear for the Row shortly before the season was abandoned due to the Covid pandemic. The return of familiar faces to the squad in the New Year had promised an exciting run-in. Instead, it became a battle off the pitch for the club's financial survival.

This battle was to continue when 2020/21 was again cut short, though not before Hartley reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, going out at National League side Dagenham & Redbridge by a solitary goal. In the Hampshire Senior Invitational Cup, a competition staged as Covid restrictions were eased, Hartley lifted the trophy in the final against Folland Sports.

There was deep sadness in 2021 when club president Bill Mitchell passed away in April. He had been a huge influence on the club and a true gentleman who continued his family's tradition of being Hartley Wintney through and through.

2021/22 proved tough, with the club's resources severely depleted. The huge task of surviving at Step 3 was achieved with another good run-in, while silverware arrived by way of the Aldershot Senior Cup, with the Row beating Fleet Town in the final. After his hugely successful spell as manager, 'Millers' stepped down at the end of the season, becoming the club's Director of Football.

Development team manager Ross Weatherstone and first team coach Ty Newton were appointed as joint managers for 2022/23. Pre-season results were encouraging, but the team struggled in the league and the pair resigned in October. Ex-Arsenal pro Ian Selley and his assistant, Mick Bennett, took charge but, after a reasonable start, results again failed to meet expectations.

With the club in the relegation zone, the Row turned to two former players, ex-pro Rowan Vine, and Shane Hollamby. The pair steadied the ship, returned belief to the fans and the playing group, and worked the team back to being competitive in every game. But the lack of financial headroom finally hit home. Without the cutting edge of a proven goal scorer to turn the draws and narrow losses into wins, the Row were relegated.

After so much recent success, 2023/24 saw Hartley Wintney FC in transition and looking to rebuild as it took its place in the Isthmian League South Central division under manager Danny Ackland. Hartley finished it's first Isthmian season mid table in 10th position.

Season 2024/25 sees another change of management and almost a new squad. Joint managers Jamie Daltry and John Cooke are looking to steer The Row to success after their own successful season at Knaphill where they took the Knappers to the CCL playoff semifinal.

A no nonsense tough tackling team player joins Hartley from Knaphill this season having contributed to the Knappers playoff semifinal journey.

AARON BURCHETT - Defender

Aaron joined The Row from Knaphill after helping them to the CCL playoff finals in 23/24.

ALEX MERRIFIELD - Defender

A solid defender, always comfortable on the ball. Alex joins The Row from Alton for 24/25 .

ELLIS ORSBORN - Defender

Central defender who initially joined Hartley Wintney in March 2023, then re-signed on a dual registration with Vanarama National League side Aldershot Town eight months later.

GEORGE WALLACE -Defender

Highly-rated left back who signed for Hartley Wintney in the summer of 2023 from Woking, where he was a second-year academy player. Despite playing at full-back, George was regularly on the scoresheet for the Young Cards. He joined Hartley in 2023 and rejoins for 24/25.

ZAC HORKAN-Defender

A tough defender who joins The Row from Knaphill having helped them to reach the playoff finals last season.

GEORGE WINSER – Defender/Midfielder

A versatile defender/midfielder, George re-signed for the Row from Binfield in September 2023, having had a brief spell with Hartley in 22/23. After coming up through the youth academy at Reading, he spent two seasons at Alresford Town, captaining the side during his time there. He joined Hartley in 2023 and rejoins for 24/25.

CALVIN CAMARA – Defender

Calvin is known to the current management, and he joins The Row from Westfield FC .

MAC FORD – Midfielder

Versatile midfielder who joined The Row from Badshot Lea after successful seasons and their promotion to Step 4.

LAMAR KOROMA - Midfielder

A strong and determined midfielder joining The Row from CCL 23/24 Champions Farnham Town.

JACK PENTON - Midfielder

An exciting young midfielder joining The Row from Burnham where he made an impressive 50 appearances in 23/24.

REECE WYLIE - Midfielder

Highly rated young winger who signed first team forms with Hartley Wintney in November 2023 after standout performances in the under-23 and youth teams.

ADERI DEDE – Forward

A driven forward, Dede joined The Row from Corinthian Casuals having impressed in pre-season.

CHARLIE POSTANCE - Forward

An imposing striker who has impressed in pre-season having joined The Row from local CCL 23/24 Champions Farnham Town.

ALEX MacALLISTER – Forward

A tricky forward who rejoins Hartley following spells at Aldershot, Welling United, Sholing and Leatherhead.

TURNELL SINCLAIR – Forward

A forward who impressed on his debut with a goal having scored 10 in 12 games at his former club Virginia Water.

TYLER HAYLES – Forward

A player that was with Hartley in pre-season and made a great impact off the bench against SCR. Previous club British Airways FC.
