DORKING WANDERERS owner Marc White took to the club's official twitter account on Monday afternoon following the FA Cup second round qualifying draw.

"Good luck to Horsham in the third qualifying round," joked the colourful Wands boss, who has taken the club from park football to the top of the Non-League Pyramid.

Since first entering the competition in 2013, Dorking are yet to reach the first round proper.

For the last two seasons – because of their then Step 1 status – White's side had a bye until the fourth round qualifying stage.

Last year, with just one win required to reach the first round, they were drawn away to...you guessed it, Horsham. The Step 3 Hornets beat them 2-0 and went on to earn a famous 3-3 draw against Barnsley and a televised replay.

They were then reinstated after their League One opponents were found to have played an ineligible player and had a second bite of the cherry against Sutton United.

So White, with his trademark humour, is expecting the worst for his side when they meet next weekend with the National League North and South clubs now entering the competition.

At the time of writing there are still some replays to be sorted but the latest draw has thrown up some intriguing games.

The first round is still three ties away but, over the coming weeks, eyes will widen as it gets nearer. For many clubs, even getting to this stage feels like making it.

How about Newcastle Town drawing former EFL side Scunthorpe United?

The National League North leaders only dropped two points in their first six games, but they haven't won an FA Cup tie since 2018.

Newcastle, 15th in NPL West, beat Long Eaton United last Saturday. They've not reached the third qualifying round since 2010.

Nails & Tickenham hosting Chippenham Town is another tie that stands out.

It's only Nailsea's second season in the competition, and they've landed a plum draw against a side three divisions above them. Having beaten Cinderford Town, Reading City and Hartpury University, they won't roll over against the Bluebirds.










Talking of good cup runs, Maidstone United's run to the last 16 was the FA Cup story of last season. That adventure began at Steyning Town Community. This time it starts against fellow National League South Hampton & Richmond Borough.

Who will make it through to the third round qualifying? Other than Horsham, of course!

George Legg (Goalkeeper) Former Reading youngster who joined the Reds in January 2024 from Hanwell Town. Has Football and National League experience. Previous clubs include Chesham United, Gosport Borough, Hungerford Town, Barnet, Boreham Wood and Aldershot Town.

Adam Hassane (Goalkeeper) Local youngster who was previously with Hampton & Richmond Borough as part of their Youth set-up. Made his debut as a second half substitute against Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the FA Cup.

Sam Wheeler (Goalkeeper) Former trialist at Premier League Aston Villa. Sam was previously with Chesham United before signing on at Honeycroft in August 2024. Great shot stopper who made his debut at home against Westfield.

Troy Murray (Defender) Young left sided defender who made his Uxbridge debut in April 2024. Represented Reading at Youth level before joining Binfield.

Bryan Taylor (Defender) Experienced defender who is in his second season at Honeycroft, after joining from Chertsey Town at the beginning of last term. Great crosser of the ball from his natural left-back position.

Jack Mullan (Defender) Started his career with Uxbridge as part of their Youth Team. Made his Reds debut as an eighteen-year-old in November 2009. Played for current manager Danny Edwards at Chalfont St Peter and this commanding central defender has also seen service with Ashford Town (Middlesex) and Wokingham & Embrook.

Matthew Kellett-Smith (Defender) Strong central defender whose experience will be a valuable asset this season. Previous clubs include Egham Town, Chipstead, Ngaruawahia United (New Zealand) and Corinthian-Casuals.

Austen Edwards (Defender) Centre-half who caught the eye at previous clubs Holmer Green and Holyport. Cool and calm defender with a big future.

Harry Hoath (Defender/Midfield) Joined The Reds in August 2024 having been at Thatcham Town last term. Formerly with Maidenhead United as a Youth, before joining Binfield. Equally at home in the middle of the park, or at the centre of defence.

Jonathan Sanchez (Defender) Strong Central defender, with experience at Westfield and Badshot Lea. Made his Uxbridge debut at Cobham in August 2024.

Chad Goulter (Defender/Midfield) Equally at home in midfield or defence, Chad will add more versatility to the Reds squad. Former clubs include: Guildford City, Chipstead, Ascot United, Ashford Town (Middlesex) and Chertsey Town.

Casey Boccaro (Defender/Midfield) Versatile player who is comfortable at full-back or midfield. Signed this summer from Virginia Water where he scored important goals from midfield.

Ekow Coker (Defender) Imposing central defender who impressed during the preseason campaign. Former clubs include Macclesfield, Ware, Enfield Town, Hanwell Town and Ashton United.

Kai Hobbs (Defender) Kai joined Uxbridge on a permanent deal this summer after impressing on loan from Basingstoke Town last term. Classy right full back who looks to have a bright future in the game.

Joshua Addae (Defender) Former Crystal Palace youngster who signed for the Eagles from Langley FC. Fleet footed full-back who likes to get forward. Made his Reds debut at Kingstonian in August 2024.

Alex Witham (Midfield) Former Arsenal youngster who played alongside Jack Wilshire for the Gunners. Talented player who is in his fourth season at Honeycroft. Former player of the year who has made over 100 appearances for the Reds.

Reece Robins (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who began his career at Walton Casuals. Part of the successful Leighton Town side, played at Badshot Lea last season.

Gregg Hackett (Midfield) Summer signing who played for North Leigh and Risborough Rangers last season. Previously at Thame United where he was regularly amongst the goals during his four seasons at the Oxfordshire club.

Charlie Davis (Midfield) Another youngster who looks to have a bright future. Signed for The Reds this season, having played youth football at both Tottenham Hotspur and Watford.

Lewis Cole (Midfield) Returned to Honeycroft last season from Harrow Borough and had a great season which saw him crowned player of the year. Combative midfielder who made his Reds debut in 2014 aged nineteen.

George Moore (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who joined us from Harrow Borough in 2023. Last seasons top scorer, which saw him voted Supporters Player of the year. Was regularly amongst the goals at Step 3.

Andrio Brandao (Midfield) Skilful, attacking midfielder who joined from Virginia Water last season. Made a big impression during the latter part of the campaign and everyone at the club is excited to watch his progress this season.

Wilson Chingoka (Midfielder) All action midfielder who joined the club in January 2024. Big personality who has experience at Step 3. Previous clubs include: Nuneaton Borough, Potters Bar Town, Lewes, Bedford Town, Staines Town and Northwood.

Glenn Yala (Defender/Midfield) Played at Chalfont St Peter for Manager Danny Edwards. Vastly experienced player whose versatility makes him a managers dream. Former North Greenford United, Waltham Abbey, Aylesbury, Hanwell Town and Chertsey Town player.

Ada Okorogheye (Forward) Came through the Academy at Slough Town before moving to the United States to study and play "soccer". Played last season at step 3 with Beaconsfield Town. Scored a hat-trick on his Uxbridge debut at Cobham in the FA Cup.

Kritpac Dzimba (Forward) Exciting young attacker who joined this summer after three successful seasons at Holyport. Another youthful player who the Reds supporters are looking forward to watching his progress over the coming months.

UXBRIDGE FC CLUB HISTORY

In the late 19th century, the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr. William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel. Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC. The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874, but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year.

The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition, and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesborough in the final at Crystal Palace. Unfortunately, their Northeast rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club, they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs, and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920.

A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3.

Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit. Championship celebrations, however, were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow.

Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War. During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town.

Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr. W.S. Try. The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963, and the club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warmup for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0. The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.

They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South-Central Division.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager in over fifty years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18 years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019. Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's. The Middlesex Chairty Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. This feat was repeated last season when North Greenford United were defeated 2-1 in the final at Bedfont Sports.

In recent times the club has mourned the passing of several club stalwarts. President Alan Odell, who had been associated with The Reds for eighty years, in 2016. Chairman Alan Holloway in 2021 and the club's long-standing Treasurer, David Tucker, passed away in 2022. "Mr. Uxbridge" had been associated with the club for over 50 years and was a massive influence in the running of Uxbridge Football Club.

From his legacy the club have been able to undertake the installation of a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, upgraded LED floodlights, a new 158-seat stand, dug-outs and both pitch-surround and perimeter fencing. More improvements are planned!

Keith McMahon: The Manager – Keith spent some time at Mayplace working with O'Boyle last season, so will be in familiar surroundings. He previously spent five years- from May 2015 to June 2020- in charge a few hundred yards away at VCD Athletic. Prior to his time at Oakwood he managed Thamesmead Town, and indeed was a big part of the club for eleven years, steering them to promotion from the Kent League and then to another promotion to our Premier Division, his side winning a famous penalty shootout over Maldon & Tiptree in the 2012-13 North Division Playoff Final. After leaving Vickers he spent time in charge of Whitstable Town.

Jack Marney: Young attacking midfielder that has played for the England 6-aside team. Previous clubs include AFC Croydon, East Preston, Merstham and Sheppey United.

Kevin Diomande: Kevin joins after reaching the Isthmian North Division Play Offs with Southall last season. The defender has also played for Bedfont Sports and Hendon previously.

Emmanuel Dasho: We add to our defence with the signing of Emmanuel Dasho. He finished last season at Witham Town and can count Aveley, Sittingbourne, Faversham and Walthamstow among his former clubs.

Alfie Bloomfield: Alfie comes in after ending last season at Beckenham Town. Our new centre-forward had previously played for Punjab United, Sittingbourne, AFC Croydon and Bromley.

Jaiden Chang-Brown: A hardworking and industrious centre-midfielder and can play as a center half. He has most recently played for Abbey Rangers and Tooting & Mitcham.

Harvey Browne: An attacking midfielder that was at Welling United's Academy before moving on to Barking FC then Tooting & Mitcham. He won the Essex Senior League last year at Tilbury FC.

Seye Okunlola: A strong and athletic attacking player that can count Marlow and Braintree Town among his former sides.

Marcus Travers: A centre-back that has plenty of experience at this level. Most recently played for Met Police and can count Corinthian Casuals, AFC Croydon, Redhill and Tooting & Mitcham among his former sides.

Ade Batula: Young hungry forward who spent last season at Epsom & Ewell following spells with Dulwich Hamlet and Chatham Town. Previously an academy player at Dulwich Hamlet and has also played for Chatham, Fisher and Spelthorne.

Harrison Mayhew: Centre-back that has just finished a great season for Crowborough Athletic. making 31 appearances as the Crows came in third in the SCFL. Before that he was part of the academy at Tonbridge Angels

Alex Gaggin: Back at the club following a spell here in 2020. The winger is well known to the boss having worked with him at VCD Athletic and Whitstable Town. His other clubs include East Grinstead and Margate.

Marcel Brown: Marcel is a dominant midfielder who has joined us from Sutton Athletic, where he played 34 league games last season, scoring 5 times.

Connor Walsh: A young keeper Connor joined us July 2024 and has previously played at Chessington and Hook.

Eri-Oluwa Akintimehim: At 22 years of age Eri is an exciting attacking player who can count Whitstable Town and Lydd Town as previous clubs. young keeper Connor joined us July 2024 and has previously played at Chessington and Hook.

Alfie Young: A highly rated left back that has had spells at Chipstead and AFC Croydon Athletic Alf joined us July 2024.

Rob Budd: Rob is a highly experienced goalkeeper who joins us in the twilight years of his career. He has worked with our manager previously at both Thamesmead Town and VCD Athletic.

Noah Joyce: Noah also joined us in July 2024, he is a 20-year-old midfielder and joins from Bromley FC.

Alfawaz Dada: Alfa is a speedy young winger who previous clubs include Hollands and Blair, Chipstead and Tunbridge Wells.

Joe Thomas: Joe was with us in season 2023/24 and soon became a favourite with the fans. An attacking player with lots of ability and energy.

Thompson Adeyemi: Thompson joins us from Epsom & Ewell and played against us in the FA Cup, where he impressed manager Keith. He will be a big presence in midfield.

Aaron Clarke: Aaron is a right back who has returned to Phoenix following spells with Corinthian Casuals and Grays Athletic.



History of Phoenix Sports

Formed in 1935, Phoenix Sports Club originally started out as St. Johns Welling, later changing its name to Lakeside, before renaming to Phoenix following the Second World War as it was seen to rise from the ashes of the previous two clubs amidst the destruction caused by the blitz.

Over the years the club has played at various locations in the local area, including Danson Park until 1950 when the local council offered them a piece of waste land in Mayplace Road East, Bexleyheath. Over time it evolved into the ground that we all know now as Phoenix Sports Club.

Both football and cricket have been played at Mayplace Road East, with many members, both past and present, representing the club in both sports. However, with the growth of junior football, cricket has now moved away.

After entering various leagues, including the Sidcup League, Kent Amateur League and the Dartford League, the club eventually settled in the Kent County League Division One West.

In the 1986/7 season, the club entered the Spartan League and competed there for six seasons. They then returned to the Kent County League - Division One - West, winning the Challenge Cup in 1993-94.

In 1999/2000 we won the league, gaining promotion to the Premier Division, however after two relegations ended up in Division Two West, finally returning to the first division in 2004/05, and then back to the Premier Division in 2007/08.

After three seasons in the Premier Division, the first team became founder members of the Kent Invicta League at Step 6 of the National League System (Step 10 of the English Football League System) – the highest level of football the club had ever played at. We went on to finish runners up, missing out by only two points to eventual champions Bly Spartans as well as reaching the League Cup Final, again losing out to Bly Spartans.

Unfortunately, the First Team and Reserve Team Management both resigned for personal reasons at the end of season 2011-2012. After an exhaustive process we appointed Steve O'Boyle and Tony Beckingham as Joint First Team Managers and John Hope as Manager for the Reserves assisted by Brian Magenis and John Barry.

Off the pitch we installed floodlights and a 108 seat stand and with further improvements around the ground we soon received an F Grade.

We had a successful first campaign under the new management structure, and after losing only two league games all season, Phoenix won the Kent Invicta League and gained promotion to the Kent League (now renamed the Southern Counties East Football League) to play at step 5 of the National League System.

We finished in sixth place in our inaugural season but had aims to do even better the next year. We had a very good start to the campaign but unfortunately lost in our first ever appearance in the FA Cup - losing on penalties after a replay.

We then began an unbelievable run in both the League and FA Vase. The Vase journey was fantastic culminating in us reaching the 4th Round Proper, where we lost to the eventual winners North Shields.

In the League we managed to lose only 1 game all season and accumulated 30 clean sheets. Due to these great performances we managed to win the League quite comfortably. Following quick and necessary works done on the ground we gained a D Grade and promotion to Isthmian League North Division.

Our first season at this level saw us finish in 14th place, which was improved upon the next year when we came 8th.

We were then the subject of a lateral movement and competed in the newly sponsored Bostik League South, for the 2017-18 season. After a decent start and sitting in the play-off spots for a while, we were

rocked by the departure of First Team Manager Steve O'Boyle. Paul Bryon came in and steadied the ship and we finished in a creditable 11th place. The following year we improved to a pleasing 9th position.

The early ends to the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons, due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, prevented us from again gaining top half finishes before a disappointing 2021/22 campaign saw us finish second bottom and get relegated down to SCEFL league.

We went into the 2022/23 season with Steve O'Boyle back in the dugout now, leading a side hungry for a quick return to Step 4. A great season saw us finish as runners up and after a late dramatic play off at VCD a last-minute penalty saw us return to the Isthmian league. Sadly, Steve O'Boyle left the club at the end of 2023/2024 after a dramatic fight for survival. He managed to avoid relegation and keep us in the Isthmian league, but felt that he couldn't carry on.

Six candidates applied for the position of 1st team manager and Keith McMahon was appointed to take over in time for the start of season 2024/25. He brings years of experience to the club and his knowledge and hardworking ethic will help give the club some stability.

Phoenix Sports are a FA charter Standard Community Club with a 1-star FA accredited rating. The highest level of recognition for us would be a 2, but to achieve that level we would need a girls or a disabled team.

Mini-soccer is played at the Mayplace Ground and Sundays are always busy with parents cheering on the young players wearing our green shirt.
